



WALKING COMFORT




More cars on the street can create an uncomfortable environment for people that are walking along and across the street.




Streets with lighting can improve pedestrian visibility and safety at night, making it easier for drivers to see people walking and making people feel more comfortable.

Outside of downtown and Indy's older, close in neighborhoods, people walking are faced with high-speed roads, having traffic, and a lack of street lights.



More travel lanes can make it hard to cross the street and increase speeding where conditions permit high speeds (e.g., wide, free-flowing travel lanes)



Illustrated above as a composite of sidewalk coverage, traffic volumes and speeds, number of travel lanes, street lighting, pedestrian comfort varies throughout the city. A ring of moderate to low comfort levels are evident outside of downtown.
